SUPPORT FOR PEOPLE ACROSS CARDIFF EAST WITH THE COST OF LIVING

This month has seen a whole raft of UK Labour Government measures coming into effect to help people across Cardiff East with the cost of living.

Wage Rises

From 1 April, full-time workers on the National Living Wage have seen their pay

increase by £900 a year, whilst those aged 18-to-20 on the National Minimum Wage have had a pay rise of £1,500.

Extra rights and protections at work

From this week, if you are ill, you'll be entitled to Statutory Sick Pay (SSP) from the first day of your illness.

This means you don't have to make yourself even more ill by going into work (and spreading your illness) because you can't afford to lose four days' pay. And for the very first time, 1.2 million workers, the majority of whom are low-paid women, get access to SSP.

Paternity and parental leave will now be available from your first day at work, removing the old requirement to be in a job for months before qualifying for support and meaning that new Dads get to spend the most important time with their new baby and partner. And a new right to leave for bereaved Dads and partners.

Lifting children out of poverty

We have abolished the two-child benefit limit, which will help lift 3070 children in Cardiff East out of poverty and 450,000 across the UK.

This will make a huge difference for children. The Child Poverty Action Group have described parents telling them that their children will now have better quality food, clothes that aren't completely worn out, be able to go on a school trip without getting into debt, have a new mattress and have swimming lessons.

Pension Increases

Because of our commitment to the Triple Lock, State Pensions are increasing by up to £575 this year.

Lower bills

Energy bills are being reduced by an average of £117.

The energy price cap has been reduced and will be frozen until the end of June. £53 million of support for people who rely on heating oil has been announced.

Rail fares have also been frozen for the first time in 30 years.

Because of the war in Iran and its impact across the Middle East and on economies globally, I know constituents are concerned about the cost of car journeys. Fuel duty has been frozen until September and what happens then is being kept under very careful review.

Drivers in Cardiff East can compare the cost of fuel offered by all petrol stations across the UK as part of the UK Labour Government's scheme to help people to shop around for the best price.

Increases to Universal Credit (Standard Allowance)

Finally, 17,000 people across Cardiff East receive Universal Credit, many in working households. The Universal Credit Standard Allowance is being increased by 6.8%.

CARDIFF LABOUR COUNCIL - LOWEST COUNCIL TAX IN WALES

Fourteen years of Tory and Liberal Democrat austerity decimated council budgets and many services. The UK Labour Government has ended austerity.

Providing a record budget settlement for Welsh Government has meant better settlements for our local Councils. This month, Cardiff Council has been able to set a budget with no cuts to frontline public services for the first time in over a decade.

Residents will rightly ask, what does this mean for me? Cardiff Labour Council's budget puts fairness, growth and residents first and we have the lowest Council Tax in the whole of Wales.

The budget secures:

- £14.1m extra for schools
- £2m extra for highways (pavements, roads and potholes)
- £14m extra for street cleaning
- £500,000 extra for neighbourhood regeneration
- £8.9m extra for children's services
- £8.6m extra for adult social care services

A NEW HOSPITAL FOR CARDIFF

The University Hospital of Wales in the Heath has been the backbone of our NHS in Cardiff for more than 50 years, but the building is no longer fit for purpose. Anyone who works at the Heath or has been there for treatment or to visit someone, can see the conditions of the buildings.

Welsh Labour believes people in Cardiff East deserve world-class clinical health facilities, and our NHS staff deserve a workplace that matches their dedication and expertise. That's why, if Welsh Labour is re-elected in May, UHW will be replaced with a modern hospital fit for the future.

But this is a political choice. Plaid Cymru claims Wales cannot afford this investment, while Reform refuses to be honest about their plans for our NHS. Welsh Labour is the only party with a bold and deliverable plan for the future of our NHS in Wales.

WELSH RESTAURANT AWARD WINNERS

ACTION ON VETS' FEES

Thousands of pet owners across Cardiff East will benefit from the first major overhaul of the veterinary sector in sixty years.

Following an investigation initiated by the UK Labour Government, the Competition and Markets Authority (CMA) found that vet fees have risen at nearly twice the rate of inflation.

Under new regulations starting later this year, pet owners will see several key changes:

- **Upfront Pricing:** Vet practices must publish a "comprehensive" price list for standard services, including consultations and common procedures.
- **Written Estimates:** For any treatment expected to cost £500 or more, you will receive a written estimate in advance and an itemised bill.
- **Transparency on Ownership:** Businesses must clearly state whether they are an independent local vet or part of a larger corporate group.
- **Easier Comparisons:** Price and ownership info will be available through the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons' "Find a Vet" service, making it easier to compare local practices.

These reforms will help pet owners understand exactly what they are paying for and choose the best value, quality care their pets deserve.

PENYLAN LIBRARY TRANSFORMATION

Penylan Library has been completely transformed.

I dropped in at the library recently with Councillors, Dan De'Ath and Lee Bridgeman to hear more about the services the library is now able to provide; from study spaces and a new community room to a refreshed children's area for story time and an expanded non-fiction collection. They've really maximised the space and the library is much lighter and brighter.

NEWS FROM ACROSS WALES

A NEW CHAPTER FOR WALES

I was at Newport Market for the launch of Welsh Labour's Senedd election campaign alongside Eluned Morgan and our brilliant candidates from across Wales.

This year marks a new chapter for Wales, focused on delivering the security and opportunities that people across Cardiff East and Wales deserve.

The First Minister unveiled five key election pledges:

- Tackling the cost of living through cheaper bus fares, lower energy bills and expanding childcare.
- Creating Jobs for the future with an Energy Independent Wales and a new Lifelong Retraining Guarantee.
- Launching a new deal for our NHS with £4bn to build new hospitals, same-day mental health support and a focus on women's health.
- Protecting the planet by cleaning up our rivers and seas, growing our National Forest and cracking down on fly-tipping.
- Delivering a fairer future ending homelessness, a pay-rise for the lowest paid workers and raising school standards.



BACKING OUR STEEL COMMUNITIES

The UK Labour Government is committed to our Welsh steelmaking communities, including constituents who work at 7Steel and Tata.

In March we published our UK Steel Strategy, with the aim of boosting domestic steel production so that 50% of steel used in the UK is made here. Of that 50%, half is expected to come from Wales.

There are changes to tariffs and quotas for any steel imported into the UK, that we make here. We're cracking down on the dumping of "dirty steel" from abroad and giving our steel producers a fairer playing field.

There are changes to public procurement for steel to back our steelworkers and steel communities. Welsh steelmaking now has a secure and bright future ahead.

PORT OF PORT TALBOT DEVELOPMENT

Port Talbot will be at the forefront of a pioneering new clean energy industry, backing thousands of good jobs and driving growth across South Wales, thanks to a £64 million grant from the UK Labour Government.

This investment will help the deep water port at Port Talbot be developed into the UK's first specific floating offshore wind port and is expected to bring thousands of jobs and over a billion pounds of investment to the area.

The UK Labour Government has also backed steelworkers and the community in Port Talbot and downstream at Llanwern with £100 million in direct support, and £500 million for the construction of a new Electric Arc Furnace ensuring that the town will manufacture clean steel into the future.

Thanks to our investment, the work of trade unions and local businesses, and the dedication and spirit of local people, Port Talbot and the whole region has a very bright future.

EXPANDING THE EDUCATION MAINTENANCE ALLOWANCE

The Welsh Labour Government is expanding the Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA) to help more 16- to 18-year-olds stay in education.

From September 2026, income thresholds will rise to £24,570 (one dependent) and £27,273 (two+ dependents), making an additional 1500 students eligible for the £40 weekly payment.

Our two Labour Governments are committed to removing financial barriers like travel and meal costs to ensure every child has the opportunity to stay in education.

COAL TIP SAFETY

I joined Deputy First Minister Huw Irranca-Davies in Tylorstown to reaffirm the commitment of our two Labour Governments to coal tip safety and maintenance.

SAFER STREETS

Our UK Labour Government is taking action to cut crime and keep our streets safe through investment in recruiting more officers. I recently joined the Policing Minister in Butetown to see how the "Clear, Hold, Build" strategy by South Wales Police is delivering results for the local community there.

This strategy is also being rolled out at my request and that of our Labour Councillors Grace Ferguson-Thorne and Owen Llewellyn-Jones, in Adamsdown. By clearing out criminal activity and reclaiming public spaces, South Wales Police are working to ensure Adamsdown is safer for everyone.

WREXHAM CITY OF CULTURE

Wrexham has officially been shortlisted for UK City of Culture, and as the only Welsh city in the running, I hope the whole of Wales is behind them.

Wrexham is a cultural powerhouse, home to a new Creative Industries Hub, the new National Football Museum, and Wrexham AFC which has become a global phenomenon in recent years.

A successful bid could secure up to £10 million in UK Labour Government funding and potentially generate over £200 million for the wider region by boosting tourism and investment.

INVESTING IN ANGLESEY FREEPORT

I was in Anglesey in March to mark the UK Labour Government's £25m seed capital funding to improve infrastructure, attract inward investment and create employment opportunities in Anglesey Freeport. I also got the chance to visit the site of one of the first Freeport projects.

What is a Freeport? It's a designated geographical area in which business who locate and invest can qualify for incentives such as tax reliefs, business rate reductions and incentives to create jobs and employ people. Anglesey's Freeport is expected to create 5,000 new jobs by 2030.

This significant announcement follows the UK Labour Government's recent announcements of the UK's first new fleet of small modular nuclear reactors on Wylfa and a North Wales AI Growth Zone, which taken together will be transformational for people in North Wales, providing opportunities for generations to come.

EXPANDING CHILDCARE FOR ARMED FORCES FAMILIES

A new Defence scheme to transform support for forces families with young children will be rolled out across Wales from September 2026.

The UK Labour Government will provide a reimbursement of childcare costs for eligible working UK Armed Forces families with children aged 9 months until they reach 3 years old in Wales.

This major boost for UK Armed Forces families will save forces families living in Wales up to £6,000 per year for each child and will help with the cost of living as they serve to protect the nation.

SPRING STATEMENT

The Chancellor's latest Spring Statement shows that Labour's economic plan is working. After years of instability, we have fixed the foundations of our economy and are putting more money into the pockets of families across Wales.

Growth: The UK now has the fastest growth in the G7. By the next election, families are set to be over £1,000 a year better off in real terms.

Lower Borrowing: With six interest rate cuts and borrowing at a six-year low, we are spending £3 billion less on debt interest. This is money that can be reinvested in our communities.

IRAN CONFLICT

The UK Government has long supported diplomatic negotiations to prevent Iran obtaining a nuclear weapon and strongly condemned the regime's appalling treatment of its own people.

The Prime Minister has been very clear that he will always take decisions in the UK national interest. He will always do what is best for the people of the UK. That is why our steps are very clearly limited to taking defensive action to protect British lives and UK interests.

With hundreds of thousands of UK nationals in the region, we have also been working around the clock to support them and get those who need to leave, home to the UK.

LATE PAYMENT CRACKDOWN

Late payments can be extremely difficult for small businesses, forcing them to decide if they can afford to keep their business running or pay employees.

There is no excuse. The UK labour Government has announced the strongest, most robust changes to payment laws in over a generation. The new laws will transform the fortunes of small businesses and make their day-to-day operations much easier.

PUBLIC SECTOR FRAUD

Every pound stolen by fraudsters is a pound taken away from our schools, hospitals, and communities. That is why the UK Labour Government is relentless in its crackdown, using smarter data and expert investigators to protect every penny.

In the last year alone, we have recovered £7.53 billion for the taxpayer. We are also intensifying the hunt for COVID-related fraud, already recovering nearly £400 million.

To accelerate these efforts, we are establishing the Public Authorities Fraud Investigation and Enforcement Service. This new unit will recruit elite investigators to recover funds and tackle the estimated £55 to £81 billion lost annually to fraud and error.

REMOVING HEREDITARY PEERS FROM THE HOUSE OF LORDS

The UK Labour Government was elected on a clear manifesto commitment to remove the right of hereditary peers to sit and vote in the House of Lords.

This change to hereditary peers is long overdue. No-one should have the automatic right to sit in the House of Lords and make laws, simply on the basis of the family they were born into.

The Bill will become law in May, after which no peer will be a member of the House of Lords on the basis of their hereditary peerage.
